Lone Star quilts are usually reserved for advanced quilters, but never fear, there are ways to simplify this complicated quilt! In this one-hour trunk show and lecture Cyndi shares a variety of Lone Star and Lone Star inspired quilts, settings and variations.

Amish lone star quilts a beautiful. Morning Star quilts are very popular with the plains Indians: Sioux, Lakota, Ojibwa.

Lone star quilts require accuracy in cutting and sewing or they will not lay flat.

Cyndi recommended taking a class or buying a book. She recommended Jan Krentz's book "Lone Star quilts and Beyond" or Judy Martin's "Shining Star Quilts".

Other tips were:

*Use Google Images for Lone Star Coloring pages and try with colored pencils before cutting your fabric to be sure of your color choices

*Pre-wash and heavily starch fabrics before cutting

*Make strip sets by cutting strips on the long side instead of cross grain
